Dear resident,

Foulden, Mordington and Lamberton Community Council (FMLCC) is in contact with Scottish Borders Council (SBC) roads department on the matter of traffic speeds through the village, via all of the formal channels. The trial speed limits are being monitored by SBC and the community. FMLCC has completed an initial feedback survey and will be providing further feedback on this matter to SBC over the next six months.

We are hearing and listening to local people's views and will be consulting with a sample of local residents prior to giving our feedback on the success or otherwise of the new signage and speed limits.

As well as speed limits, we are in contact with the roads department regarding the general state of the roads and the verges - it is an ongoing process. There is a very limited budget for this work. Furthermore some SBC road work staff have been redeployed to support the work of other council services as a result of the COVID19 pandemic. Be aware that progress we are making with the council will take time.

Please be assured, the topic of roads is discussed regular by FMLCC. Once we are eventually able to get back to in person meetings, we will be able to welcome people along to Community Council meetings to express their views in person.
