Volunteering:

We have been in contact with Scottish Borders Council. The lead person for refugee families in the Scottish Borders is **Graham Jones**, Safer Communities & Community Justice Manager.

He says: "The situation at present is that Scottish Borders Council have been in regular contact with the Home Office and COSLA [Convention of Scottish Local Authorities] in preparing to host Afghan families, none have arrived yet, though will be arriving in the coming weeks.

It is difficult to predict what each family will require until they actually arrive and as you would expect we need to be sure the families are receptive to any offer of support out with statutory services. Support could be material, practical and /or emotional.

We have volunteers who assist with our Syrian families. They are required to apply as SBC volunteers, provide 2 references and a PVG [Protecting Vulnerable Groups] for vulnerable adults and children. Generally support has been for language and integration."
